Press Release Community College System of NH (April 16, 2014) *Tuition Will Go Down At NH Community Colleges* - Students at New Hampshire's seven community colleges will see lower tuition bills starting in the fall, 2014 academic year. The Community College System board of trustees today announced a five percent tuition reduction, bringing the instate per credit cost to \$200 from its present level of \$210. A three-credit course will cost \$600, down from \$630. For an in-state student taking a minimum full-time course load of twelve credits per semester, annual tuition

Education News (May 30, 2014) Vermont Passes Law For Universal Early Education - Vermont Governor Peter Shumlin announced on Wednesday that he has signed a bill that gives every 3 and 4 year old child in the state access to a minimum of 10 hours a week of free pre-K education. The law will add about \$10 million in costs to the state education fund within the next seven years. However, its backers believe those costs will dramatically offset what would otherwise be heavy payments to special education and youth correction facilities. (read more)

Boston Globe (May 26, 2014) Once-Hailed Salad Bars Gone From City Schools - They stopped selling junk food at lunch and they persuaded a health-conscious food organization to donate a salad bar for their cafeteria so students could eat fresh romaine, cherry tomatoes, and bean salads instead of ice cream and potato chips. By all accounts the fight against childhood obesity and diabetes appeared to be on the upswing at the Curley K-8 School in Jamaica Plain. The salad bar, offered twice a week to the upper grades, was a big hit with about half the students. But it's gone. (read more)
